The walks last about two hours and start from the bridge over the river close to Gloucester Lock just off Severn Road. There is charged parking off the bypass, in Severn Road and at Blackfriars all within 5 minutes of the start of the walk. Generally, the paths are good but walking shoes are recommended, and leg covering as one or two routes can be narrowed by nettles in summer. Alney Island has a long and interesting history, as Gloucester's front door to the west it has seen battle and threat. The creation of the island through flood and its affect on British history are surprising. It will be an interesting addition to your knowledge of Gloucester and a pleasant surprise to add to walks around the city.
