#### **Beatrix Potter**

In 1903 Beatrix Potter published one of her most loved tales, The Tailor of Gloucester. It was inspired by a visit she made to the city. This guided walk takes in the places of Gloucester which are closely connected with Beatrix Potter. The walk will appeal to adults and children.

**This tour is not wheelchair accessible.** This underground chamber on Eastgate Street reveals the remains of the Roman city defences and the East Gate dating back to about AD 68 when Gloucester was founded. # **NEW for 2025: Eastgate Street**

Take a tour along this tree lined Gate Street and see the Roman remains at the site of the East Gate. View the impressive 19th century buildings which include The Guildhall and Market Portico. Hear stories and anecdotes about the people and events that contributed to the prominence and history of Gloucester.



# **Hillfield Gardens**

Take a guided tour of these beautiful gardens which have many fine trees. The gardens are home to three monuments of historical significance: Scriven's Conduit, the King's Board and the chancel of the 12th century leper chapel of St Mary Magdalene. The walk covers some uneven ground in places so sensible footwear is essential. The Chapel will also be open on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> September 14.00-16.00 for general visits.

Two metres below ground, The King's Bastion contains remains of the Roman city wall and a defensive tower, probably constructed during the reign of Henry III, and is located under a trapdoor in the King's Walk Shopping Centre. Having been closed for a few years, we are delighted to offer these tours again this year for Heritage Open Days.

Tours are suitable for ages 13+ (no unaccompanied under 18s). Not accessible by wheelchair or suitable for those with mobility issues. Please wear footwear suitable for uneven surfaces (no heels/open shoes).

# Llanthony Secunda Priory ◆ G1 & (some uneven paths)

This guided walk explores the priory which was founded in 1136. Marvel at the magnificent medieval timber roof and late 15<sup>th</sup> to early 16<sup>th</sup> century brickwork. By the end of the 15th century, Llanthony was the richest Augustinian house in England entertaining the court of Henry VII in 1500 and 1501. In the medieval period the scholars of Llanthony Secunda created a very special library that is still considered one of the richest and best-documented medieval English book collections in the country, now scattered across the world.

Gloucester has surprising offerings in musical invention, performance and personnel, always backed by the strength of the Three Choirs Festival.

This tour examines Gloucester's dockland railways and the almost archaeological traces they left behind. The circular walk encompasses Victoria Basin, Barge Arm, Merchants Road and St Anne's Bridge, returning via Llanthony Quay and West Quay to end at North Warehouse.

This tour tells of Richard III's important three-day visit to Gloucester in 1483, as part of his Royal Progress. It explains the granting of the significant Charter to the city. You will hear how he spent his time here and be shown some of the buildings Richard would have seen.

For over 1100 years Gloucester's history has been shaped in no small part by the interest, patronage and occasional displeasure of the reigning monarch. Down the centuries, kings and queens of England have come to Gloucester to hold parliament, equip armies, grant charters, go hunting, be crowned, and be buried. This tour will take a look at some of buildings and places in Gloucester at the heart of this extraordinary royal history and reveal some of the fascinating stories connected with them.



#### Saxon Gloucester

Discover the traces of Gloucester's Saxon history. Hear the story of Aethelflaed, the daughter of Alfred the Great who became Lady of the Mercians. Aethelflaed built St Oswald's Priory and was buried there in 918. Learn about the role she played in shaping the city as we know it.



# The Siege of Gloucester 1643

This guided walk visits some of the places of interest connected with the siege of Gloucester which took place during the English Civil War. The siege was arguably Gloucester's finest hour when the small garrison of parliamentarians held out against the might of the Royal Army led by the King himself.

A walk along the Twyver where it forms the boundary between Abbeydale and Abbeymead. See the sites of some of the now dismantled mills, the likely places where the Romans started the canal into the city and the Royalists cut off the water supply during the Siege of Gloucester. Stout shoes required. There is ample parking by Abbeydale Community Centre.



# Westgate Street and Cathedral Quarter Heritage Walk ◆ D6 ₺ Market Mar

One of four original Roman routes, Westgate is one of the oldest and best, preserved areas of Gloucester and the main commercial route linking the Cathedral to the rest of the city. See its array of stunning historic buildings including the 15<sup>th</sup> Century timber framed Fleece Inn, Judge's Lodgings and The Folk of Gloucester. Find out how the Heritage Action Zone, with the award of nearly £2m, is helping to regenerate and revitalise the buildings and life in this area.



The Fleece Inn was built around 1500, one of the "Great Inns" built by St.Peter's Abbey. By 1665 it was known as the Golden Fleece which reflected the wool trade. The property was sold by the church in 1799 and remained in private ownership until 2004. Now owned by Gloucester City Council, it is being completely renovated and you have a chance to look at the building work in progress and see some points of interest that have been uncovered. The 12<sup>th</sup> century tunnel vaulted undercroft is thought to be the best example in Europe of a rich merchant's warehouse. Known locally as the "Monks Retreat", it was a lively and much loved bar when the Fleece was last open.

Note: steep, ancient steps unsuitable for those with mobility issues.

The art installation 'We Are Gathered Here', created by students at Gloucestershire College, will once again fill the church. Depicting a congregation in silhouette, it pays homage to the people who have contributed to Westgate Street and Gloucester's fascinating heritage over time.



# St Philip and St James Church





Sunday 14th September 13.00-16.00

Larkhay Road, Hucclecote, Gloucester GL3 3NS

The church was opened in 1851 as a daughter church of the ancient church of St Bartholomew's, Churchdown to cater for Hucclecote's growing population. It was built in medieval gothic style by the local architect's firm of John Jacques & Son who were also responsible for the Mariners Chapel in the docks.

# St Swithun's Church

St Swithun's Road, Hempsted, Gloucester GL2 5LH

A Church has existed in Hempsted from 826 and the 12<sup>th</sup> Century Norman font was in the original church. The present church is mid-15<sup>th</sup> century and extensive renovations took place in 1885 with the addition of an extra bell, monuments and stained glass. In the well-kept churchyard is "The Cavaliers Tomb" of Captain John Freeman who was slain at the siege of Gloucester in 1643. St Swithun's Church is still in use today.




