


Guided Walks and Tours of Historic Gloucester Programme for Schools

The City of Gloucester has a rich history. From its time as a Roman Colonia, through its transformation in Saxon times, Royal Parliaments in the Medieval period, and the Civil War to its industrial transformation into an inland port.

Gloucester Civic Trust aims to bring Gloucester's unique and varied history alive for your students with our guided walks and tours.



We are able to offer a range of guided walks that reflect the curriculum, including:

- Roman Gloucester / Eastgate Chamber
- Medieval Gloucester
- Victorian Docks
- Saxon Gloucester
- Siege of Gloucester
- Beatrix Potter

The length of the walk can be tailored to the group but typically is no longer than 1.5 hours.

Please note: all school groups must be accompanied by teachers / appropriate adults. The maximum group size for walks and tours is 15 pupils. Larger groups will be accommodated by additional guides.

Primary school groups are charged at £3 per pupil. Secondary school groups are charged at £4 per pupil.

We are also able to offer guided tours for primary school children of Bishop Hooper House – a set of 16th Century Tudor buildings in Westgate Street that is now home to The Folk of Gloucester (formerly the Folk Museum). As well as tours of these buildings, the Folk can arrange for the children to talk with our resident artist imagining who used to live in these buildings in the 16th and 17th century.
