
## THE SAINSBURY MURAL

Images from Gloucesters history

- 1 Dobunnic coin showing stylized horse and wheel
- 2 Dobunni, the name of the tribe occupying Gloucestershire at the time of the Roman conquest
- 3 Coin of Allectus, Emperor of Britain AD 293-296
- 4 Romanesque head found on Debenhams' site, now in the City Museum
- 6 Figure of a Roman legionary soldier
- 7 Figure of an early British chieftain
- 10 Repeat panel, with pattern from Bronze Age pottery, now in the City Museum
- 13 The Birdlip Mirror, native Celtic circa AD 25, now in the City Museum
- 14 Bodvoc, name of Dobunnic chieftain

- 19 Osric, chieftain of the local Saxon people, the Hwicce, and founder of St. Peter's Abbey, now the Cathedral, circa AD 681
- 20 Ethelflæda, daughter of Alfred the Great, the Lady of the Mercians. Gloucester was called a Royal City in her reign
- 22 Glevum (the Roman name for Gloucester) one of four coloniae in Britain.
  Coloniae had the highest status of Roman provincial towns
- 23 Coin of Allectus, Emperor of Britain AD 293-296
- 24 Dobunnic coin showing stylized horse and wheel




- 5 Decorative panel repeated six times, with designs from Iron Age, Saxon, Norman, and other early sources
- 8 Coin of Eisu, Dobunnic chieftain circa AD 30-43
- 9 Coin of Nerva who founded the colonia of Glevum AD 96-98
- 11 Tombstone of Rufus Sita, Roman cavalryman, found at Wotton Pitch, now in the City Museum
- 12 Eagle standard of Roman legion
- 15 Shaft of Anglo-Saxon cross circa AD 900 found at St. Oswald's Priory, now in the City Museum
- 16 Coin of Henry 111.

  'Ricard on Glov' means
  minted by Richard
  at Gloucester
- 17 Coin of William the Conqueror minted at Gloucester
- 18 Severn Bore water pattern

- 21 Old Gloucester heifer, and Cotswold ram lamb. Folk Museum
- 25 Terminal of ceremonial sceptre in native Celtic style, 1st century AD Found on Sainsbury's site now in the City Museum
- 26 Repeat panel, with pattern from a Roman millstone, now in the City Museum

## Hare Lane, Gloucester

- 27 Norman capital from the Cathedral crypt
- 28 Coin of Eisu, Dobunnic chieftain circa AD 30-43
- 29 Roman antefix (roof ornament) probably from a tomb. Found near the Cathedral
- 34 Repeat panel, with pattern from Beaker period pottery
- 38 Figure of an abbot of Gloucester of the late Middle Ages
- 39 Figure of a Norman soldier
- 42 Gleaweceastre, Saxon name for Gloucester
- 43 Severn coracle and paddle
- 44 Token commemorating the start of work on the Gloucester and Berkeley canal, now in the City Museum
- 46 Cup from Roman mosaic found at the Dolphin Inn (42 Northgate Street) used here upside-down as a symbol of the city's bell-founding industry. Now in the City Museum
- 47 City Guild Merchant seal circa 1200



- 30 Roman votive tablet to Mercury and Rosmerta, found at 96 Northgate St., now in the City Museum
- 31 Coin of Nerva who founded the colonia of Glevum AD 96-98
- 32 Coin of Henry 111
- 33 Lamprey and eel basket. Folk Museum

- 35 City coat of arms granted under Henry VIII, 1538
- 36 City coat of arms granted under Cromwell, 1652
- 37 "Success to the Cultivation of Waste Lands" legend and plough motif from local token coin, 1795
- 40 Symbol of agriculture
- 41 Coin of William the Conqueror, inscribed Pillemus Rex 1 (P is a Runic character used for W)
- 45 Repeat panel, with pattern from Roman mosaic floor
- 48 Repeat panel, with formalized sun motif
- 49 Gloucestershire Old Spot "Chedworth Pansy 22nd" Folk Museum
